Any month of the year in London you can see will fantastic free public art and sculpture but with the return of the capital's biggest art event this month, Frieze London, autumn offers a unique time to reflect and reenergise in the city.

'Antelope' on the Fourth Plinth



The Fourth Plinth in Trafalgar Square is probably the most famous public art commission in the world with a reputation built on diverse commissions that respond to the complex and contemporary issues we face today.


Artist Samson Kambalu's new sculpture, 'Antelope', continues this rich tradition celebrating Malawian Baptist Preacher Chilembwe who defied the colonial rule that forbade Africans from wearing hats in front of white people.

Frieze Sculpture 2022



A major free public exhibition in Regent's Park featuring 19 large-scale works by artists including John Giorno, Ro Robertson and Ugo Rondinone, curated by Clare Lilley (Yorkshire Sculpture Park Director). There's also a very good audio tour and interactive map to help get around. Running until 13 November.

Illuminated River



A long-term art installation transforming the Thames at night with an orchestrated series of light works that span nine bridge, designed and programmed by New York-based artist Leo Villareal. Capture an autumnal sun set along the river for a perfect 'Instagrammable' moment.

Sculpture in the City



Sculpture in the City is an annual sculpture park that uses the urban realm as a rotating gallery space. From a giant sandwich to an invading arcade monster, explore 20 artworks from artists including Sarah Lucas and Jesse Pollock on display in the City of London's financial district. Running until spring 2023.

<u>The World Reimagined – Globe Trail</u>



Explore a trail bringing to life the reality and impact of the Transatlantic Trade in Enslaved Africans via 10 colourful globes are located across the City of London. Each globe structure was designed by an artist responding to themes, ranging from Mother Africa to Still We Rise and Expanding Soul. Running until 31 October


